<b>00:00-00:18</b>	Moving shot of the Bidi Bidi refugee settlement driving through one of the roads where the host community lives.
<b>00:19-00:41</b>	Wide shot of Nangule, the village within Bidi Bidi where members of the Ugandan host community live.
<b>00:42-00:52</b>	Mid shot Nangule, the village within Bidi Bidi where members of the Ugandan host community live.
<b>00:52-01:27</b>	Children in Nangule play a game, sitting on the floor.
<b>01:28-02:00</b>	Members of Welthungerhilfe's farming field school meet and sing a song together in Nangule, Bidi Bidi, a host community village.
<b>02:01-02:30</b>	Ayikorau Mauzu, 27, walks through Nangule village with her children.
<b>02:31-02:43</b>	Ayikorau Mauzu, 27, checks on her cassava plants in Nangule village.
<b>02:44-02:46</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: My name is Ayikorau Mauzu.
<b>02:47-02:51</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: We welcome the refugees to our district. The reason I welcome them is:
<b>02:52-02:59</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: Since the refugees came, many organisations came to our place, for instance Welthunger. [Hilfe].

<b>03:00-03:06</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: As soon as Welthunger [Hilfe] came, we got many things. We became happier. They gave us knowledge.
<b>03:07-03:20</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: Knowledge to dig [farm]; they gave us many inputs. For me personally, I received a menstrual cup.
<b>03:21-03:36</b>	To-camera interview with Ayikorau Mauzu, 27: Like I said earlier, they gave us knowledge. I am now empowered. We are drinking clean water.
<b>03:37-03:45</b>	To-camera interview with William Omara (following tabs til the end): My name is William Omara. I work for Welthungerhilfe in Yumbe as Head of Project. I've been here since 2016 when the emergency started.
<b>03:46-04:14</b>	When the refugees came in 2016, they were in dire need. At that time, we had to bring in quite a lot to lifesaving situations. But as time has gone on, almost 7 years down the road, you could see - if you move to the settlement - most refugees are settled in their homes. It is hard to differentiate who is a refugee and a national staying together.
<b>04:15-04:35</b>	We had quite a number of interventions: livelihood, WASH, water supply, sanitation and hygiene in communities. One thing I must say is that issues of water supply have tremendously improved. I think it's something we greatly contributed to as WHH in the course of our intervention.
<b>04:36-04:50</b>	When you move around the settlement, as of now you will see a lot of kitchen gardening taking place. You will see most of the refugee population is involved in one or two businesses. This is a result of the livelihood interventions we have been doing.
<b>04:51-05:08</b>	Of course, one of the things we have done deliberately in our intervention as WHH is to include government strategies in our intervention. And one of the key strategy that we embedded in our intervention is refugee-host community empowerment.
<b>05:09-05:29</b>	That talks about 30-70 percent intervention. 70 percent ratio goes to refugees in terms of our intervention; 30 percent to the host community. We started this kind of strategy long time ago, way back in 2016. This really paved the way for us to bring refugees and host community together.

**05:30-05:58**

One of the things that we must know is that they are currently - as we talk - because of our intervention, it has brought their living peacefully. The refugees tell us that they are now in a position to get land for agriculture for free because of what we are doing deliberately to integrate refugees and host communities together in groups.
